EDITORIAL

This issue will present five topics related to a variety of tourism. the first topic is about marine tourism, the second topic is about emotional work. the third topic discusses culinary SMEs as part of the tourism industry, the fourth topic deals with agroedutourism, and the last topic discusses the Critical Success Factors in the Operation of Hotels.

The first about marine tourism. Marine tourism is an important attraction of natural tourism Indonesia today. The development of culinary products as a model for culinary tourism development in Indonesia. It aims to improve the welfare of small and medium creative industries in the food and beverage sector in the Greater Bandung area.

The fourth paper is about the Potential of Highland Tropical Wheat As an Object of Agroedutourism to Promote Tropical Wheat Development. This paper want to know the potential of wheat farming in Getasan district as an object of agro edu-tourism and analyzed its development strategy to support tropical wheat production. Qualitative methods were used, with an interview with various tourism related stakeholders.

The final paper shows a Review on the Critical Success Factors in the Operation of Hotels. This article studies the CSFs for the hotels' operation in the past studies. To do this, the hotel-related CSFs for operation of different types of hotels were first compiled through the review literature. Then, the main issues, gaps, and conditions of the studies have been considered. Further studies are also suggested based on the identified gaps in the reviewed literature.
